Elizabeth Beck grew up in Southwest Fort Worth, attending J.T. Stevens Elementary School where she was a cheerleader for the JOC football team, and graduating from Southwest HS. After high school graduation she entered the US Army and served for eight and a half years including several combat tours. Bachelors and Masters degrees from UTA were earned in City Planning. She then went on to earn a law degree from Texas A&M. Elizabeth was elected to serve on Fort Worth City Council representing District 9 in 2021 and is currently running for re-election.

According to Elizabeth, Fort Worth is the fastest growing city in Texas, now ranked #4. The" new" City Hall is now located in the "old" Pier 1 building. This consolidates city offices from eleven buildings to one! Downtown is changing as well as other parts of the city. The Convention Center is undergoing a major renovation. Bicycle officers have been added to the Magnolia area. MedStar ambulance services are going away. Ambulance services will become part of the Fort Worth Fire Department. The old B.H. Carroll apartments (once part of the Baptist Seminary housing on McCart) are now a Community Land Trust being developed as affordable housing.

Several of Elizabeth's relatives and friends (who also happened to be former students of Tommy Janes) were guests at the luncheon. All were present when Elizabeth announced that Tommy is to be honored by the City Council on Tuesday, February 25 at 10 AM for his youth work through education and Optimist sports programs. The guests were Curtis Sanders, Randall Moore, Jimmy Edmondson and Jimmy's son Riley (not one of Tommy's former students). Randall was the proud recipient of Boo Card #13. He had some kind words to say about Tommy.
